

# Chemotherapy, Investigative Drug, and P-Listed Drug Segregation and Disposal

Waste Category	Examples	Treatment/Disposal	Container
<p><b>Chemo or Investigative Drug Liquid</b></p> 	<p><b>Bulk Examples</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Non-empty syringes, vials, or I.V. Lines (not leaking)</li> <li>• Investigative drug vials</li> <li>• Fluids or devices removed from intra-cavity installations</li> <li>• Empty containers from P-listed solid drugs</li> <li>• Closed system drug transfer devices, pharmacy compounding</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Pharmaceutical waste container, submit EHS waste pick up request form for disposal within 90 days of first use</li> <li>• Containers purchased at University Stores</li> <li>• Stickers available from EHS</li> </ul>	
<p><b>Chemo or P-listed Drug Solid</b></p> 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Materials used in spill cleanup</li> <li>• Heavily soiled items used in compounding</li> <li>• Contaminated PPE</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Pharmaceutical waste container, EHS waste request within 90 days of first use</li> </ul>	
	<p><b>Trace Examples</b></p> <p>Not visibly contaminated items used in prep or admin of chemo</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Pharmacy/Nursing items</li> <li>• Empty IV bags, bottles, vials, containers, and syringes</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Disposal by medical waste vendor, collect in approved chemo (yellow) sharps containers, dispose within 90 days of first use/or ¾ full.</li> </ul>
